Engineering Dreams: The Untold Rise of Women in India

In the quiet corridors of India's engineering colleges, a silent revolution has been unfolding for more than three decades.

From a time when only a handful of women dared to enter technical institutions, today, nearly **30%** of engineering classrooms are filled with women — dreaming, designing, and leading. This journey of **steady, untold progress** reflects not just statistics, but **the spirit of perseverance, courage, and ambition** of countless women across the nation.

The story of women in engineering began with pioneers who broke new ground against all odds. In 1943, **Ayyalasomayajula Lalitha** became India's first woman engineer, graduating in Electrical Engineering from the University of Madras (College of Engineering, Guindy). Soon after, in 1944, **P.K. Thressia** followed as the country's first woman Civil Engineer, also from Guindy.

In 1951, **Ila Majumdar** (later known as Ila Ghose) shattered more barriers by becoming India's first woman Mechanical Engineer, graduating from Bengal Engineering College, Shibpur (now IIST).

A few years later, **Shakuntala A. Bhagat** earned her Civil Engineering degree from VJTI Mumbai in 1953 and later achieved a Ph.D. in Structural Engineering from the University of London in 1960 — making her the first woman in India to reach such a milestone.

In the world of aerospace and defense, **Tessy Thomas** graduated with a B.Tech in Electrical Engineering in 1985 from Calicut University and went on to become the first woman to head an Indian missile project (Agni-V) at DRDO.

Adding to the list of early pioneers, **Dr. Rama Shanker Dubey** rose to leadership in Chemical Engineering research during the early 1980s.

Each of these women laid a foundation not just of achievements, but of inspiration — opening doors for generations to come.

A Journey Still Unfolding

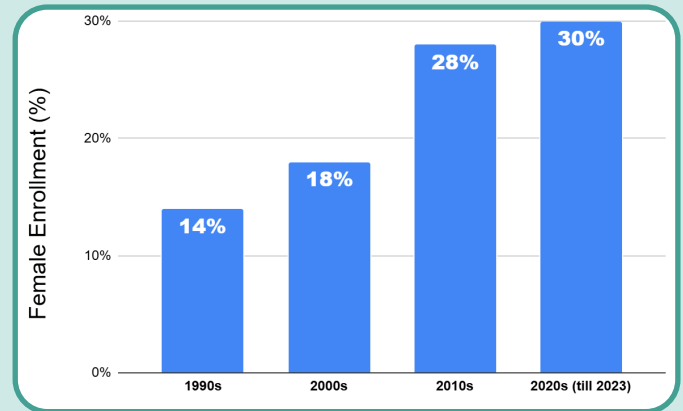
